A Note from the Nurse

I hope you had a wonderful summer break and are ready for the new school year. If your child needs an inhaler or epi-pen/Benadryl, please bring it to the nurse's office **and alert me of all allergies/Asthma, and medical issues** in order to help me keep your child safe while at school. Required Long-Term, Short-term, and Non-prescription (OTC) medication(s) forms are all found on the KPBSD website or in the office. For those with younger students, it is helpful to have an extra change of clothes in their backpack in case of accidents.

With the return to school comes the increase in exposure to germs-bacterial and viral. To decrease the exposure to germs, encourage your child to get lots of rest, fluids and to wash their hands frequently. If your child has had a fever greater than 100 degrees in the last 24 hours, vomited or had diarrhea during the day/night, or they have a persistent cough, they need to stay home from school.
