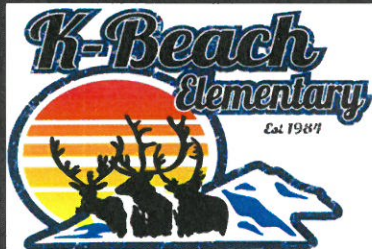

A Note from the Nurse

I hope you had a wonderful summer break and are ready for the new school year. If your child needs an inhaler or epi-pen/Benadryl, please bring it to the nurse's office **and alert me of all allergies/Asthma, and medical issues** in order to help me keep your child safe while at school. Required Long-Term, Short-term, and Non-prescription (OTC) medication(s) forms are all found on the KPBSD website or in the office.

For those students with frequent potty "accidents" please place an extra change of clothes in their backpacks.

With the return to school comes the increase in exposure to bacterial and viral germs. Please encourage your child to get lots of rest, fluids, and to wash their hands frequently. If your child has had a fever greater than 100 degrees in the last 24 hours, has vomited or had diarrhea during the day/night, or they have a persistent cough, they need to stay home from school.
